A City Council Work Session will convene at 6:00 p.m. to conduct interviews of all qualified applicants. Following the interviews, City Council will move into regular session to consider and vote on nominations for the vacant City Council Position #2.

The Work Session and Regular City Council meeting are public meetings and thus open to the public. Meetings are held in the Fairview City Council Chambers located on the second floor of the Fairview City Hall at 1300 NE Village Street, Fairview, Oregon.

### Christmas Tree Recycling

With the holiday season right around the corner, it is time to begin decorating our homes. When it comes to Christmas Trees, you might consider using a live tree that can be planted later in your yard or donated to a local school, church or other organization. If you plan on using a more traditional tree, please plan ahead to recycle it at the end of the holiday season in early January 2014. In Fairview, our local franchised hauler, Twelve Mile Disposal, will collect your Christmas trees after the holidays. Please place the undecorated tree at the curbside on your normal collection day. If the tree is over 8 feet please cut in half or break down and place in the yard debris container. Business owners and apartment managers should contact Twelve Mile Disposal at 503.661.0255 directly to make arrangements to have Christmas trees picked up and recycled. If you are a tenant, please be sure to ask your manager to arrange for this service.

### Basic Mediation Training – Applications Due February 10, 2014

East Metro Mediation will teach mediation in a 42-hour course to be held on Wednesday evenings and all day Saturdays in March and April. The deadline for applications is February 10, 2014. Participants will learn skills of communication, negotiation, neutrality and conflict resolution through presentations, exercises, discussions, practice, and reading. Mediation skills are useful in work groups, businesses, neighborhoods and families. The training includes working with people individually over the phone, and in face to face meetings.
