By the time that you receive this, your City Council should have made the final decision as to accepting or not accepting the bid to finally do the work that is necessary to complete the enhancements of Park Cleone. This is so very important, because it is a visual message to all our citizens how important this Historic Old Town, or just Old Town, whichever you prefer to call the area, is. I know from talking with many residents of Historic Old Town how much all of the renovations will result in Park Cleone being a place to more frequently use and enjoy, and how it symbolizes as a source of pride for many, many years to come.

On July 1st the administration is authorized, through the budgeting process, to begin the process of hiring our 16th police officer, finally bringing our police force up to full strength with scheduling two officers on duty 24/7, 365 days a year. Commemorative Bench Program & Fundraiser

The City is partnering with Eagle Scout candidate, Austin Arnold, to collect donations for commemorative benches for the City parks. You can purchase a bench to commemorate the life of a loved one, honor a living individual or group, or perhaps commemorate a business in the community. More information will be available on the City's website in the next few weeks. The cost for one bench is \$467(not including a plaque.) Forms will be available soon. Austin's project goal is to also fundraise enough money to purchase 1-3 benches and install them in select locations in the city. Austin will be running a can drive from July 15-31st. Austin will be picking up cans from various neighborhoods on Saturday, July 26th from 10-2pm (please feel free to leave cans on your porch). The city will also be accepting cans at the drop off site by the dumpsters in the City Hall parking lot from July 15-31st.
