I am pleased to announce that the city will implement an automatic payment plan for utility customers in September. If you choose to enroll, monthly or bimonthly utility charges will be automatically withdrawn from your account. The automatic payment program will simplify the bill paying process for those who elect to participate. There will no longer be a need to remember to pay the bill by the due date, mail a payment, pay in the office, over the phone, or online. This service is optional and detailed instructions regarding how to enroll will be sent with your next utility bill.

Remember; when your car's leaking oil on the street, it's not just the street it's leaking on.....

When it rains, stormwater flows over driveways, streets and parking lots picking up oil, grease, and chemicals. The runoff flows into the storm system which leads directly into our neighborhood creeks, lakes, and wetlands. A large percentage of water pollution comes from vehicles leaking fluid. Motor oil is the largest single source of oil pollution in our waterways. Oil and other petroleum products can be toxic to people, wildlife, and plants.

We all benefit from having clean water, it's important for our health and economy. Clean stormwater provides us with recreation opportunities, fish and wildlife habitats, and it adds beauty to our city. Each of us has a role in keeping our stormwater clean. The City of Fairview is working hard to protect water quality in our streams, but we need your help.

Here are some tips to use when maintaining your car:

- Use a commercial maintenance business. They will recycle fluids properly.
- Check for oil leaks regularly and have them fixed.
- Use drip pans to collect any fluids when doing engine work.
- Clean up any spills immediately. Don't rinse with water to the storm system. Use sand or kitty litter which can be swept and disposed of in your garbage.
- Collect all used oil in containers with tight fitting lids. Recycle used motor oil at the curb.
- Never dispose of oil or other engine fluids down the storm drain, on the ground, or in a ditch. For proper disposal information, contact Twelve Mile Disposal at 503-661-0255 or Metro Recycling Information at 503-234-3000.
