Spring Clean Up

To encourage spring cleanup, 12 Mile Disposal customers will be allowed the equivalent of five, 30-gallon trash cans free of charge on their regular trash pick-up day during the week of May 16th. Also, the City of Fairview has arranged with Allwood Recyclers, at no cost to you, for residents to drop off up to two cubic yards of yard debris during the month of May 2016. (No sod or dirt will be accepted). Allwood Recyclers is located at 23001 NE Marine Drive in Fairview. Residents must present a coupon and Fairview identification to be eligible.

Fairview Yard Debris Coupon 2016 Free Yard Debris Disposal

With this coupon, Fairview residents may bring up to two cubic yards of clean yard debris for free disposal to Allwood Recyclers during the month of May. Allwood's location is 23001 NE Marine Drive, Fairview Oregon 97024.

Budget Committee Update

The Fairview Budget Committee has been diligently reviewing the proposed budget for the fiscal year 2016-17. The 14 member volunteer committee, 7 City Councilors and 7 citizen representatives, have met 3 times thus far. The next meeting is scheduled for May 2. The Budget Committee has the legal authority to change any portion of the proposed budget and is responsible for passing the City's approved budget.



Once the Budget Committee completes their review and approves the budget, the City Council will consider adoption of the approved budget at its June 1, 2016 meeting.
