Are you Prepared?

Now that Spring is officially springing we should keep up the momentum of thinking about emergency planning for ourselves, our neighborhood, and our city. To that end, there are a couple of items I'd like to point your attention towards.

1) A new publication from the City of Fairview entitled, "**Connection is Protection.**" This small booklet will give you some basic information to get started with your emergency planning. This booklet is intended to start the conversation in your household and with your neighbors about planning for an emergency or disaster situation. The free booklet is available in hardcopy at City Hall. You will also be able to find the booklet available on the City's website in PDF form available for downloading and printing at home.

2) On **April 6 and April 13** the City of Fairview is hosting a **Disaster Preparedness Seminar**. This free two day seminar will cover the types of hazards we face here in Fairview and, more importantly, how to start getting prepared for them. You can sign up for the seminar through a link on the City's website. This course will be instructed by a member of the Multnomah County Department of Emergency Management. This seminar has been supported and made possible through the efforts of the Fairview Public Safety Advisory Committee (PSAC).

As you approach your Spring cleaning efforts at home, take some time for preparedness! And as always, stay safe out there!
