Extra Patrols Added for July 4th

The Fairview Police Department would like to remind everyone to have a safe and happy Fourth of July. In that regard, the Fairview Police Department will be adding extra patrols for the July 4th holiday.

The extra patrols are in response to numerous fireworks related complaints from 2016. An illegal firework is any firework that travels more than 6 inches on the ground or more than 12 inches in the air.

The City of Fairview is offering a new safe location for people to meet up for online sales deliveries and child custody transfers.

This new “safe exchange zone” is on the west end of Fairview City Hall. (Village Street). The area is clearly marked and under surveillance 24/7.

This project was spearheaded by members of the Public Safety Advisory Committee who wanted members of the community to feel safer during online sales transactions or child custody transfers.



The Fairview Police Department also offers the following tips:

- If possible, arrange for any transfer to happen during daylight hours.
- Do not accept checks or gift cards.
- Take a friend with you.
- Do not open wallet or purse in front of strangers.
- Do not give personal information.

Mayor's Thoughts... Update on the Fairview Police Department merger with the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office (MCSO). I have facilitated two town hall meetings thus far. There was good attendance and great questions. The MCSO gave a detailed presentation on the service levels and additional services they could provide Fairview. A few highlights in the draft contract are that Fairview would have a deputy sheriff officer on duty in Fairview 24hrs/7days/week and one additional officer on duty 10hrs/7days/week at our peak call times which are yet to be determined. In addition, there will be one supervising sergeant on duty 24hrs/7days/week and often 2 sergeants. If Council decides to merge with MCSO; we are projecting a 5 years savings of \$193,000 compared to our estimated costs if we did not merge. There still are ongoing negotiations with the unions that may change this savings amount. The next town hall meeting is scheduled for June 8 at 6:00 PM at City Hall, 1300 NE Village Street in Council Chambers. Please plan to attend if you have questions or if you want your opinion heard. Unless there are changes I plan to put the merger on the June 21, 2017 council agenda for a vote. **Mayor Ted Tosterud**
