Street Light Trouble?

Street lights located in Fairview are owned, operated and maintained by the Mid-County Lighting District.

There are several options to report a street light issue.



Contact the city of **Fairview Public Works Department**. Staff will then handle the reporting to Mid-County Lighting District and will track until completed. Call 503-674-6223 or send an email to woodl@ci.fairview.or.us or report directly to **Mid-County Lighting District**. Call 503-988-0164, send an email to lightout@multco.us, or use a mobile/desktop app - <https://yourgov.cartograph.com/> or download the Cartograph YourGov app using your Android or Apple device from the Google Play Store or Apple App Store.

When reporting a street light outage or repair, it is very helpful if you provide the address the pole is nearest to, the map and pole number, and what the problem is, (light out, flickering, on all day). Most light poles have a metal tag located on them which has the map and pole number.

The "safety zone" is located on the west end of Fairview City Hall (Village Street). The area is clearly marked and under surveillance 24/7.

The Multnomah County Sheriff's Office offers the following safety tips:

- If possible, arrange for any transfer to happen during daylight hours.
- Do not accept checks or gift cards.
- Take a friend with you.
- Do not open wallet or purse in front of strangers.
- Do not give personal information.

City Council Recruiting for Budget Committee & Planning Commission Members

The Fairview City Council is recruiting for one (1) open Planning Commission position. The Commission is composed of seven (7) Commissioners who are an advisory body to the City Council. They review and make recommendations on short and longer term issues and policies related to land use regulations and community development within Fairview. The Planning Commission plays an important role in shaping the future of Fairview.

The Budget Committee has three (3) open positions. It is comprised of seven (7) citizen members and seven (7) City Council members. The votes of all members are equal. The Budget Committee is the fiscal planning board of the City. It reviews the proposed budget and has the legal authority to change any portion of the proposed budget and is responsible to pass the City's approved budget. The Committee meets annually, usually in early May.

Applications will be accepted until all positions are filled. All candidates must be interviewed by City Council to be considered for appointment.
