
Meetings Coming in May

Tips to Help Keep Your Mail Safe from Theft

Mail theft is when someone steals mail or parcels out of your mailbox. While many thieves are just looking for cash and valuables, identity thieves also know your mail contains a lot of valuable personal information—like credit card numbers, investment account information, social security numbers, insurance policy information and more.

Tips From the Postal Inspector's Office:

- Pick up your mail promptly after delivery—never leave it in your mailbox overnight.
- If you change your address, immediately notify your Post Office™.
- Tell your Post Office™ when you'll be out of town, so they can hold your mail until you return.
- Consult with your local Postmaster for the most up-to-date regulations on mailboxes, including the availability of locked centralized or curbside mail boxes.
- If you see a mail thief at work, or if you believe your mail was stolen, call police immediately, then call your local Post Office™.

Mayor's Thoughts...

Would you like to share your thoughts about what East Multnomah roads should look like in the next 5, 10 and 20 years from now? You can do that on Monday, April 9 at 6:30 PM at the Wood Village Baptist Church, 23601 NE Arata Road, Wood Village.

Every few years Multnomah County updates a 20-year plan of roads to improve. This includes crosswalks and signals, guardrails, wider shoulders, turn lanes, bicycle and walking paths, and more.

Fairview needs sidewalks and curbs on NE 223rd from NE Fairview Lake Road to NE Sandy Blvd and from NE Sandy Blvd to NE Halsey Street.

The railroad bridge on 223rd Avenue is a safety concern because there are no sidewalks or curbs under the bridge. You must walk on a narrow dirt path or navigate out in traffic to get past the railroad bridge.

Fairview is currently working with Multnomah County to begin a design phase for the sidewalk and curbs under the railroad bridge. Once that is complete Union Pacific Railroad must approve the design and then we can begin looking for funding to complete the project.

You can help with these concerns by voicing your opinion to our county officials. Look forward to seeing you at the meeting and hearing your thoughts. **Mayor Ted Tosterud**
