Fiscal Year 2018-19 Budget Approved

The Fairview Budget Committee unanimously approved the \$24.7 million Fiscal Year 2018-19 Budget at their May 14 meeting. All programs are budgeted to continue as currently offered.

The approved budget is available for viewing at City Hall or at www.fairvieworegon.gov. The City Council will consider adoption of the approved budget at their June 6 meeting. All members of the public are welcome.



Rate Increase

Utility rates are reviewed every two years to ensure adequate funding for maintenance and improvements of the utility systems.

Effective with July billing, storm water rates will increase 9%. This will result in an 86 cent (\$0.86) increase in a typical residential storm water charge, which is a 1% increase in the average residential customer's utility bill. Water and sewer utility rates did not increase.

Council Recruits for Urban Renewal Planning Committee Members

The City Council is investigating forming a Fairview Urban Renewal Agency to aid in advancing economic development. Part of this process is creating a Urban Renewal Plan to identify if an Urban Renewal Agency could be beneficial.

To this end, the Council created a Urban Renewal Planning Committee tasked with creating the plan, with the assistance of a consultant, to forward a recommendation to Council. The Committee will be comprised of Mayor Ted Tosterud, two City Councilors, one Planning Commissioner, one Economic Development Advisory Committee member, and two citizens. Each position will be appointed by the City Council.

Citizens interested in serving on the Committee, should submit a completed application to the **City Recorder by 5:00 PM on June 18, 2018**. Hello Fairview Neighbors. Spring is finally in full swing and summer is almost here. Along with all our normal spring cleaning chores we want to keep our streets, and community, safe and looking good. To help with that I wanted to point out that this is the time of year when neighborhood parking complaints; which, are often overlooked during the dismal, rainy winter days, become more frequent. To prevent costly parking citations I wanted to remind everyone of some of the most commonly reported parking violations:

Fairview Municipal Code 10.05.110 & 10.05.120 Method of Parking

No person shall stand or park a motor vehicle in a street other than parallel with the edge of the roadway, headed in the direction of lawful traffic movement, and with the curbside wheels of the vehicle within 12 inches of the edge of the curb, except where the street is marked or signed for angle parking.

Prohibited Parking or Standing. No person shall park or stand:

A vehicle in violation of state motor vehicle laws or in violation of a lawfully erected parking limitation sign or marking.

A vehicle in an alley other than for the expeditious loading or unloading of persons or materials, and in no case for a period in excess of 20 consecutive minutes in any two-hour period.

A vehicle over, upon, or in such a manner as to prevent access to any water meter, gate valve, or other appliance in use on any water meter connection or appurtenances to any other city-owned utilities, located on public property, the public right-of-way, or private property.

Any motor vehicle or trailer other than a passenger vehicle on a street between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. of the following day in front of or adjacent to a residence, motel, apartment house, hotel or other sleeping accommodation.

Prohibited Parking. No operator shall park and no owner shall allow a vehicle to be parked upon a street for the principal purpose of:

1. Displaying the vehicle for sale.
2. Repairing or servicing the vehicle, except repairs necessitated by an emergency.
3. Displaying advertising from the vehicle.
4. Selling merchandise from the vehicle, except when authorized.

Mayor's Thoughts... I want to thank our Community Engagement Committee for the wonderful celebration of Fairview's 110th Anniversary. If you couldn't attend you missed many excellent stories and memories from our citizens and great food and beverages.

The Budget Committee has approved the FY 2018-19 budget. It will be forwarded to City Council for a final vote at their June 6 meeting.

I am including in this month's article an announcement from the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) about ramp closures at the west end of I-84 this summer. This has not received much publicity yet and I want you know about the ramp closures, so you can plan accordingly. **Mayor Ted Tosterud**

Oregon Department of Transportation

I-84 and I-5 Interchange Resurfacing – July & August 2018: Expect Congested Traffic

ODOT will close the bridge ramps connecting I-84 and I-5 in order to have three of the four ramps resurfaced, replace bridge joints and perform other structural repairs. The project is expected to cost \$6.5 million dollars. "This summer, travelers in the Portland metro area will see the busiest construction season in about the last 10 years!" ODOT Spokeswoman Kimberly Dinwiddie said.

Construction Impacts

This work will require around-the-clock two week closure of three of the bridges that connect I-84 and I-5 in July and August 2018. Only one bridge will close at a time.

The bridge that connects I-5 northbound to I-84 eastbound will only require nighttime closures.

In addition to the two-week closures, overnight ramp closures could occur nightly from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. through November 2018. More details will be available as construction progresses.

Schedule

Construction June - December 2018

The following ramps will close for 24 hours a day for up to two weeks:

10 p.m. Sun., July 8 to 5 a.m. Mon., July 23: I-5 southbound ramp to I-84 eastbound closed

10 p.m. Wed., July 25 to 5 a.m. Mon., Aug. 6: I-84 westbound to I-5 northbound closed

10 p.m. Fri., July 27 to 5 a.m. Thurs., Aug. 2: Only one lane open on I-84 westbound from Lloyd Center to I-5. The far left lane will remain open during this period.

10 p.m. Fri., Aug. 17 to 5 a.m. Mon., Aug. 27: I-84 westbound to I-5 southbound closed leaving only one lane of I-84 westbound open from Lloyd Center to I-5. The far right lane will remain open during this period.
