Notice of Budget Committee Meetings

The **Fairview Budget Committee** will meet Monday, April 29 at 6:00 PM in Fairview City Hall Council Chambers to deliberate over the proposed budget for fiscal year 2019-20. Subsequent meetings will be Monday May 6 and May 13 at 6:00 PM, as needed. The Budget Committee is comprised of 14 volunteer members; 7 City Councilors and 7 citizen representatives.

The purpose of the April 29 meeting is to receive the budget message and hear public comment. Any person may appear at the meeting and discuss the proposed programs with the Budget Committee. All of the meetings are open to the public. The proposed budget will be available for viewing beginning April 22 at City Hall or www.fairvieworegon.gov.
