Working Smoke Alarms Save Lives - DO YOURS WORK?

Smoke alarms are important because during a fire, you may have less than three minutes to escape. They alert you to the danger and give your family time to get out. You are four times more likely to survive a home fire if you have a working smoke alarm.

For increased protection, make sure you have working smoke alarms on every level of your home (including the basement), inside each bedroom, and in the hallway outside each bedroom.



Keep smoke alarms working properly. Test your alarm batteries by pushing the test button at least once a month. Replace the battery at least once a year. Replace all smoke alarms that are 10 or more years old.

If you own your home and are low income or elderly, and don't have a smoke alarm, or need replacement batteries call Gresham Fire & Emergency Services at 503-618-2355 and ask about the Smoke Alarm Program.


