I. CALL TO ORDER/
ROLL CALL

Mayor Weatherby called the meeting to order at 4:00pm

II. CITY COUNCIL INTERVIEWS

Council discussed the process that would be used in the interviews. All candidates would be asked three standard questions with follow-up questions being offered by Council as time allowed. Each candidate was allowed 20 minutes for the interview process. The three standard questions were as follows:

1. If appointed to Council, what would you consider your role and responsibilities to be to:
 - a. Fairview citizens
 - b. Mayor and Council members
 - c. City Staff
2. If a vote were taken on a matter that would affect you personally in either a positive or negative manner, how would you deal with the situation?
3. What do you see as the role of the Council?

Michael Braeback, 2645 NE 205th Avenue, Fairview, responded to the questions as follows:

1. If appointed to Council, Mr. Braeback stated that his responsibilities as a Councilor would be to represent the interests of Fairview citizens. Mr. Braeback stated that his responsibilities to the Mayor and Council would be to support them and offer new viewpoints. Mr. Braeback stated that his role concerning city staff would be to help them in any way possible.
2. When asked how he would deal with a situation that would affect him personally, Mr. Braeback responded that he would go with the best interests of the community without regard to his own personal interests.
3. When asked what he viewed as the role of the Council, Mr. Braeback responded that he felt Council's role was to represent Fairview in the best way possible. Mr. Braeback also felt it important to interact with citizens in order to learn about important issues.

Larry Cooper, 844 NE Market Drive, Fairview, responded to the questions as follows:

1. If appointed to Council, Mr. Cooper stated that his responsibilities as a Councilor would be to represent all citizens in every area of Fairview. Mr. Cooper stated that his responsibilities to the Mayor and Council would be to discuss the various issues facing the city and to represent the city's interest. Mr. Cooper stated that his role concerning city staff would be to work with them through the direction of the City Administrator.
2. When asked how he would deal with a situation that would affect him personally, Mr. Cooper responded that it would be his duty to represent the city's interests and not his own.
3. When asked what he viewed as the role of the Council, Mr. Cooper responded that Council's role was to be the policy-making body of the city.

Francis Doo, 2022 NE 213th Avenue, Fairview, responded to the questions as follows:

1. If appointed to Council, Mr. Doo stated that his primary responsibility as a Councilor would be to listen to the concerns of citizens and to represent them. Mr. Doo felt that his responsibilities to the Mayor and Council members would be to work with each of them to accomplish what was best for the citizens of Fairview. Mr. Doo stated that his role with city staff would be to provide them with clear direction.
2. When asked how he would deal with a situation that would affect him personally, Mr. Doo responded that even though he might not always agree with the majority, his primary duty would be to deal with the situation in a way that benefited Fairview as a whole.
3. When asked what he viewed as the role of the Council, Mr. Doo responded that he felt Council's role was to make sure the city operated within its guidelines while guarding the welfare of its citizens.

David Jauchius, 525 Harrison Street, Fairview, responded to the questions by stating that his role on the Council would be to guide the city.

Barbara Jones, 3201 NE 223rd Avenue, Fairview, responded to the questions as follows:

1. If appointed to Council, Ms. Jones stated that her role as a Councilor would be to be there for all the citizens of Fairview. Ms. Jones stated that her responsibilities to the Mayor and Council would be to voice her opinions while still being a team player. Ms. Jones stated that her role with city staff would be to listen to and provide direction for staff members.

2. When asked how she would deal with a situation that would affect her personally, Ms. Jones replied that a Councilor's vote has to represent what is good for the city without regard to how it would affect them personally.
3. When asked what she viewed as the role of the Council, Ms. Jones responded that the role of Council is to ensure, through leadership, that the city is run in an efficient and orderly manner.

Ken Quinby, 22002 NE Shaver Ct, Fairview, responded to the questions as follows:

1. If appointed to Council, Mr. Quinby stated that his responsibilities as a Councilor would be to represent the citizens of Fairview through listening and responding to those citizens. Mr. Quinby stated that his responsibilities to the Mayor and Council would be to engage in good communication and to work together with respect for each other. Mr. Quinby stated that his role with city staff would be to engage in effective communication and respect.
2. When asked how he would deal with a situation that would affect him personally, Mr. Quinby responded that his personal point of view would be irrelevant; he would focus on the overall affect of the decision for the majority.
3. When asked what he viewed as the role of the Council, Mr. Quinby stated that the role of Council should be as mediator and communicator.

Following the interviews, it was decided that each Councilor would choose two candidates from the list of applicants. The two candidates with the most votes would receive further consideration. The results of this ballot were as follows:

Michael Braeback:	0
Larry Cooper:	5 (Lillard, Owen, Trees, Raze, Weatherby)
Francis Doo:	1 (Cornelius)
David Jauchius:	0
Barbara Jones:	3 (Lillard, Raze, Weatherby)
Ken Quinby:	3 (Owen, Cornelius, Trees)

As Barbara Jones and Ken Quinby each received the same number of votes, three candidates were included for further consideration.

A second ballot was cast to narrow the choice from the three top candidates. The results of the second ballot were as follows:

Larry Cooper:	3 (Lillard, Weatherby, Owen)
Barbara Jones:	1 (Raze)
Ken Quinby:	2 (Trees, Cornelius)

Councilor Lillard moved and Councilor Owen seconded the motion to appoint Larry Cooper to Council Position #3.

ABSTAINED:	0

Councilor Cooper reported that he would be resigning from the Budget Committee.

Councilor Lillard moved and Councilor Raze seconded the motion to adjourn. Mayor Weatherby adjourned the meeting at 7:25pm.
