The purpose of the May 11 meeting is to receive the budget message and hear public comment.



The Fairview Urban Renewal Agency Budget Committee will meet Monday, May 11 at 7:30 PM to deliberate over the proposed budget for fiscal year 2020-21. The meeting will continue to Monday, May 18 at 8:30 PM, as needed.

It is anticipated the meetings will be held virtually via Zoom. What to do if You Can't Pay Your Utility Bill

The City has extended the suspension of both utility bill late payment fees and disconnections due to non-payment until June 1st. We realize many have been affected financially by the COVID-19 pandemic and will do our best to assist you.

Spring Clean-up

The week of May 11, Twelve Mile Disposal will allow up to five 30-gallon containers or the equivalent to, on a customer's normal pick up day. Multifamily residents can leave 1 bulky item per unit in their complex's enclosure for pickup that week. Allwood Recyclers will accept drop-off of up to two cubic yards of yard debris with the attached coupon. Residents must present a coupon and Fairview identification to be eligible.

With this coupon, Fairview residents may bring up to two cubic yards of clean yard debris for free disposal to Allwood Recyclers during the month of May. Allwood's location is 22800 NE Marine Drive, Fairview Oregon 97024.
