

COVID-19 Relief Program Extended to October 31

The Fairview City Council extended the Relief Program to October 31 for Fairview businesses and residents who have experienced a loss in income due to COVID-19. Eligible applicants are located within the City of Fairview or in an unincorporated area of Multnomah County that is served by a Fairview utility account. Amount of assistance relates to the utility bill and assistance funds are distributed via check.

Everyone living in the United States as of April 1, 2020 is required to complete the census. You can take it online at 2020census.gov.
