FROM THE DESK OF MAYOR MIKE WEATHERBY.....

Hello, I'm again glad for the opportunity talk about what is going on with you all. We are currently reviewing a proposal from Portland State University (PSU) regarding a study to determine the feasibility of the consolidation of various city services between the cities of Fairview, Troutdale and Wood Village. If practical, there could be the potential for cost savings by increasing efficiencies in the delivery of services. The results of the study will provide valuable information to our elected officials and you– the citizens of Fairview. Any consolidation of services would NOT affect the independence of our City- it would only give us one more tool to provide exemplary service while saving money. As the process with PSU continues, I will ensure that you are kept informed.

Additionally, as you might have read in the newspapers, METRO concluded their *Corridor Study* detailing the traffic needs encompassing the areas between Interstate 84– South to Oregon Highway 26. METRO presented their findings for adoption to the four East County Cities of Fairview, Gresham, Troutdale, and Wood Village. All jurisdictions endorsed the need for the projects identified in the *Corridor Study*. One of the improvements important to the City of Fairview is the widening of 223rd Avenue to meet increased traffic needs in preparation of the hoped for USS Ranger's arrival. During the course of the *Corridor Study*, METRO decided to include studying the areas from Oregon Highway 26 south to the Clackamas County line; however, the did not choose to include the areas north of Interstate 84 extending to the Columbia River. These areas are of significant importance to Fairview!

Also, please come out and celebrate summer with Fairview and attend the Fairview on the Green Chili Cook-Off on Saturday, August 25, 2012 from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. There is fun for all ages. I hope to see you there!
