Stormdrain Cleaning Assistance Program Available to Fairview Businesses

The cities of Gresham, Troutdale, Wood Village and Fairview are partnering to offer private stormdrain cleaning to businesses at a reduced cost. The Stormdrain Cleaning Assistance Program (SCAP) takes place in October before the heavy rain season. Businesses that sign up through this coordinated program will have stormdrains cleaned for a \$44 flat fee per drain by a private company. Typically, companies may charge \$120 or more to mobilize and clean one drain and add fees for additional drains. Gresham has offered this cost-effective stormdrain cleaning program since 2003; over the years the service area has been expanded to include the cities of Troutdale, Fairview and Wood Village.
