



1 Chinook Landing*
 Chinook Landing has a great variety of activities for recreational use. These activities include: archery, boating, and fishing. Chinook landing has restrooms and picnic tables available for use.

2 Blue Lake Park**
 Activities in Blue Lake Park include: archery, professionally designed 18 hole disc golf, boating, canoeing, fishing, and swimming. There are restrooms, playgrounds, picnic tables, and covered picnic tables available with grills. The 18 hole disc golf course is conveniently located next to Blue Lake Park!

3 Lakeshore Park
 Lakeshore park is a haven for bird enthusiasts and provides scenic views of Fairview Lake and Mount Hood. It has a small dock available for the launching of small, non-motorized watercraft, and extensive green space for individual activities.

4 Pelfrey Park
 Pelfrey Park is a great place for children. The park has a playground, picnic tables, and approximately 1.7 acres of lawn. Pelfrey Park is pet friendly.

5 Hockaday Park
 Hockaday park consists of two benches pointed towards Fairview Lake. This is a great spot to sit and relax.

1 Handy-Nechocokee Park

This park offers a historical perspective of Fairview while providing the opportunity for picnicking and the enjoyment of the nicely planted gardens. It also has a children's play structure and swing set.

2 Fairview Woods Wetland Park

Fairview Wood Wetlands Park has an extensive series of nature walks providing the opportunity for visitors to experience native plants and a variety of bird species.

3 Park Cleone

Park Cleone is our oldest neighborhood park and includes a combination of play, natural resources and picnicking opportunities. This park has our largest play structure, which is also ADA accessible. Other facilities include a gazebo, half-court basketball, and open space for individual activities.

4 Marilyn's Park

Marilyn's Park is a serene setting in a nicely landscaped area adjacent to local bus routes. It provides benches to sit and relax for those walking in the city.

5 Fairview City Pocket Parks

The Fairview City Pocket Parks are green spaces spread throughout Fairview Village, providing opportunity for rest and relaxation. For more details pick up the "Walking the Pocket Parks" map.

6 Fairview Community Park

This park is the focal point of Fairview Village. It includes a children's play structure, picnic tables, and a trail to Salish Ponds Nature Park. The Fairview Community Park also has a large gazebo that is popular for weddings, graduation photographs, and other celebrations.

7 Salish Ponds

Salish Ponds provides a unique opportunity to experience nature within the urban environment. With its extensive trail system, fishing spots, and wildlife viewing platforms, this park is a great resource for those seeking an outdoor experience. The park is also connected to the Gresham-Fairview Trail and is a popular stop off for local bicyclists.
